## Eaglepointe Landslide Update

The city awarded a contract with Cracar Construction to remediate the landslide that occurred August 5<sup>th</sup>, 2014. At that point it was thought that the entire area of the slide would be remediated. Although the city has made various offers to landowners, the city was not able to get access to all the property it needed to complete the more comprehensive remediation. The City Council, with other affected property owners— Eaglepointe Development, Questar Gas and Kern River Gas, concluded that going forward with a scaled-down remediation was much better than leaving the hillside in its post-landslide condition. While all contributing partners in the remediation would have liked to do more, the current remediation removes significant hazards that could have intensified and caused more damage. At present, the contractor is only about one month away from completing this phase of the construction which will achieve a number of important goals.



First, the 60' scarp, or cliff, that remained after the slide has been graded back so that it no longer poses a threat if someone were to get too close and fall. Second, the grading to the proposed slope achieves much greater stability and mitigates the continual sloughing of rocks that has been occurring for the last year. Third, the contractor has filled in and smoothed out the middle of the landslide which consisted of very rough terrain of peaks and crevices which also posed a hazard. Fourth, when complete next month, Pace Lane and all its utilities will have been realigned and rebuilt a safe distance away from the crest of the slope. And finally, this project will re-contour the middle of the slope in a way that water runoff from storms will be collected and piped to our storm water collection system. Upon completion the entire slope will be seeded with a native seed mix formulated to grow in this soil and provide erosion control.

The total cost of the project is \$708,312. It appears that the project will come in within budget and not cost the City or its partners any more than what was anticipated. The city is paying \$265,000 to the project with the other parties contributing the balance of the funds to Cracar. While there still remains damage and un-remediated parts to the landslide, they are contained to one property owner who has up to this point decided to deal with those issues individually.

## Discover the Trails of NSL

Autumn is one of the best seasons for you and your family to discover the beauty along the NSL trails in the Wild Rose Trail system. Begin at Wild Rose Trailhead Park located at 650 East Skycrest Lane. (Take Eagleridge Drive to Eaglepointe Drive. Continue south onto Skycrest Lane. The park is located a few hundred feet at the end of the street.) From Wild Rose Trailhead Park, there are

several hiking and biking trails including:

**Wild Rose Loop Trail** (easy, 2 miles).

**Wild Rose Loop Trail shortcut** (easy, 1.2 miles).

**Chukar Loop Trail** (intermediate, 2.5 miles)

**Wild Rose Trail to Valley View bench** (easy 1 mile).

**Wasatch Forest lands user trail** starts at the Valley View

bench on the Wild Rose Trail going east (intermediate to difficult. Distance: 1 to 50+ miles).

## Trimming Guidelines for Street and Sidewalk Trees

Winter is coming! City Code requires that trees, or other growth, must be trimmed eleven feet (11') above the street or seven feet (7') above the sidewalk (City Code 7-1-4).

Maintaining these clearances may take multiple trimmings annually. Low hanging tree branches reduce visibility for drivers, damage vehicles and equipment, and make it difficult

to clear streets of snow and debris. Please take a few minutes to measure your trees, and if needed, trim any branches not meeting the clearance requirement.



## Winter Parking Goes Into Effect November 1

As a reminder beginning Nov. 1, there is no overnight on-street parking allowed between the hours of 11:00 pm and 6:00 am. Parking is also restricted during any period that snowplows are actively operating. (This would be when snowfall is

accumulating on the roadway.) These regulations are in place to enable the efficient and safe removal of snow and ice from public streets. Violation of this ordinance is a Class C misdemeanor and may result in a citation and impoundment of

vehicles. The police and public works departments are requesting residents' voluntary compliance with this ordinance in order to avoid citations and towing incidents. These restrictions are in place until April 1.
