Utility Rates

The City Council has authorized some utility rate changes effective July 1. We are pleased to report that garbage rates will decrease \$2 (for first can) due to a well-negotiated contract renewal with Waste

Management. Culinary water rates will be raised by 3% to keep up with the city's cost of providing homes and businesses with clean water. The storm drain utility fee will also be raised \$2 per month

for residential properties. For businesses, the storm drain utility fee tiered rate system will be eliminated and replaced with the same per unit rate structure as residential properties. Please visit www.nslcity.org for more information about these changes.



Upcoming Construction Projects

Several streets will receive asphalt preservation treatments beginning in June. Affected residents will be notified of closures and detours (usually lasting no more than 24 hours). These treatments will smooth roadway travel and add years of life to the streets. Please follow posted closures and detours, as active work zones can be hazardous. Fresh

preservation materials can also be damaged by vehicles, bicycles, pedestrians, and pets.

Other projects:

Woodbriar Way is scheduled to have secondary water services installed and all asphalt replaced this summer. Depending on funding, Woodbriar Cir., Mariwood Cir. and the southern section of Tanglewood Loop will also have this work done.

Foxboro Park – A new city park is currently under construction at the corner of Elizabeth and Norfolk Drives and should be completed by the end of June.

Street striping – Over the next few weeks, crews will be repainting all traffic lane stripes and pavement symbols throughout the city, mostly at night. See www.nslcity.org for more info.

Be Water Smart

Turf studies have shown that most lawns only need to be watered once every 3 to 4 days to stay healthy and green. Watering everyday creates shallow roots. Watering infrequently develops deep roots and healthier turf. Grass roots grow deeper into the soil and become stronger with less watering.

Free Residential Water Check

Did you know Weber Basin Water Conservancy District will come to your home and check your water use? A water check is a series of tests on the irrigation system, performed to determine how much water the irrigation system is putting out (precipitation rate), the infiltration of water into the soil, and the distribution uniformity (evenness of the application of water). The Weber Basin Water employee also checks soil type, root depth and sprinkler pressure. The entire process takes about one hour and the homeowner is left with a customized irrigation schedule and recommendations to better the system. This water check program is a free service and is offered from May to August. **To schedule an appointment call Weber Basin Water at 801-771-1677. www.weberbasin.com/conservation.**
