EAGLEWOOD GOLF COURSE



A MESSAGE FROM PUBLIC WORKS

What You Should Know

- Lilac-Ash Borer is a very destructive pest to many species of ash trees.
- Adults emerge from host trees and lay eggs in the spring; larvae feed on wood within branches, overwinter in the heartwood, and emerge as adults the following spring.
- Subcontractor Salt City Trees will be treating the trees in your area twice, once in May and again in June.
- Permethrin is the insecticide that will be applied, it is commonly used but should not be touched by people or pets until the spray has dried.

Public Notice

North Salt Lake City subcontractor Salt City Trees will be using the insecticide Permethrin on Ash trees in your area to control the Lilac-Ash Borer. Left untreated these clearwing moths can kill branches or entire trees. Treatment requires two separate applications, one in May and another in June using the insecticide Permethrin. Permethrin affects the nervous system of insects, it is more toxic to insects than it is to people, dogs, and cats. In an effort to keep you informed we have posted links on our website with information about the Lilac-Ash Borer as well as the insecticide Permethrin.

Prices vary depending on size of pavilion and day of the week.

CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

• **Reconstruction of 500 North: 400 West to Franklin Parkway** – This section of 500 North will be reconstructed in order to handle the additional traffic loading when the expansion of the nearby FedEx distribution hub is complete. Work will begin soon and will affect the road for a minimum number of days.

• **Overlay of Springwood / Springridge Neighborhood** – In order to prevent structural deterioration and more expensive repairs in the future, several streets in the Springwood Drive neighborhood will have their asphalt ground away and replaced this year. The extents of the project depend on funding availability, but the streets planned to receive an overlay treatment are: Springwood Drive, Springwood Circle, Lillywood Lane, Springridge Drive, and Springridge Circle.

• **Street and Trail Preservations** – Several streets and pathways in the City will receive asphalt preservation surface treatments later this year. Affected residents and trail users will be notified in advance so as to be minimally inconvenienced by closures and detours (usually lasting no more than 24 hours).
