HOW MUCH?

The average home price in North Salt Lake is \$302,000. The proposed tax rate change would increase the property tax payment for the average homeowners by about \$2 per month or \$25 per year.

The average home price in the City of North Salt Lake is \$302,000.




PROPERTY TAX

The city council is tasked with determining how to prioritize and fund city services such as police and fire protection; physical infrastructure including roads, parks, open space and buildings. Looking to the future, the city has identified a need for two additional police officers and the repair and replacement of existing park infrastructure and other deferred maintenance.

In order to fund the public safety positions and park projects, the city will need a property tax increase. The city has not increased property tax rates in over twenty years, and an increase of 10% is proposed, which would increase ONLY the city's portion of your total property tax. Below is a graph showing the distribution of the property tax dollars you pay.



CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

• Street Preservations -
Three streets in the City will receive asphalt preservation surface treatments in late July. These are: Franklin Parkway, 500 North, and upper Woodbriar Way (above Woodbriar Circle). Affected residents and businesses will be notified in advance so as to be minimally inconvenienced by closures and detours.

• Union Avenue Water Services -
We are in the process of switching from an old culinary water line to an existing newer line for businesses on Union Avenue. Water delivery will likely be disrupted for short periods of time in coordination with affected business operators.

• Hatch Park Parking Lot -
A permanent parking lot for Hatch Park will be constructed on the vacant

lot at 103 N. Main Street later this summer. It is planned to provide 44 additional parking spaces.

• Center Street Reconstruction -
A small portion of Center Street at 1455 West will be reconstructed in August. The Center Street bridge across the Jordan River will be closed for seven days to complete the work. Message boards will be placed on Center Street to give drivers advance notice of closure dates.

• Questar Projects -
Questar will be working on Highway 89 through October. They will also be doing pipeline work along the NSL portion of Legacy Trail beginning in September and continuing through November.
