For the last four years, Cairo has been an integral part of our police department. He has responded to hundreds of calls for service; from helping search for lost children and looking for intruders in large businesses to finding hundreds of pounds of illegal drugs and "showing-off" at schools and community events. Cairo has finally reached that point in his life that he can no longer effectively function as a police dog. He will be missed by those who have seen him in action, and by those who haven't, but have benefitted from his traits and training.

The police department is actively pursuing means to acquire another K-9 partner for our city, especially to serve our children and the hundreds of alarmed businesses that a K-9 can very effectively protect. CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

- Hatch Park Parking Lot- A permanent parking lot to serve visitors to Hatch Park has been completed at 103 North Main St. Adjacent landscaping to the west will be finished in the coming weeks.
- Porter’s Landing Canoe Take-Out - Work has begun on a boat ramp and small parking lot at 50 South Jordan River Dr. to provide safe and legal access to the waters of the Jordan River. It is expected to be complete by the middle of May, with a ribbon-cutting ceremony scheduled for June 3rd.
- 350 North Street - In June work will begin installing a new, larger water line between Main Street and Highway 89 to better serve the City’s culinary water needs. When that is completed, the road will be reconstructed and resurfaced. Please watch for construction equipment and personnel along 350 North for several weeks this summer.
- Eagleridge Storm Drain - A section of storm drain near the bottom of Eagleridge Drive is currently under repair. Please watch for equipment and personnel on the south side of Eagleridge Drive near its intersection with Valley View Drive (350 East).
- Highway 89 Storm Drain - Work has begun on a new storm drain line along the east side of Highway 89, between Center St. and Odell Lane. Please watch for temporary lane closures and construction activities for the next two months.
- Fox Hollow Drive Reconstruction - A failing section of this road between Foxboro Dr. and the Foxboro wetlands will be reconstructed. When the project begins in May, the road will be temporarily closed to traffic. Please watch for advanced notification and follow provided detours.
- Legacy Trail - The trail is expected to be re-opened by the end of May. Questar will be working in the Foxboro right of way between Center Street and 100 North beginning around April 24th with overnight construction hours. Travel lanes will be open during daylight hours.

REMINDER



Reminder: Landscape materials - rock, sand, top soil, bark, etc. cannot be stored in the public right of way. This is critical to protect storm water lines. Also, deliveries should be made on private property only.
