Who is at my door? Solicitors in North Salt Lake

A message from the North Salt Lake Police Department

Every year legitimate businesses work to get the word out about the products and services they offer to our residents by soliciting door-to-door. This is a legal and acceptable method for these entities to market their businesses and reach potential customers. North Salt Lake City allows this method of sales, but realizes there needs to be a balance of respecting peoples' privacy and feelings of safety with the need for business to be able to market their wares. In reaching this balance, the City has implemented procedures for solicitors to follow in order to be able to conduct business in this manner. All legitimate solicitors must obtain a solicitor license and display their badge clearly when conducting business

in the city. A few other points for our residents to be aware of: Solicitors are prohibited from conducting business at a residence or place of business that has a "No Solicitor's" sign displayed on or around the door. If you don't want to be approached, please give notice by placing a sign. If you don't have a sign up, but you are not interested in conversing with the solicitor, the solicitor must immediately and peacefully depart. Solicitors may not operate before 10:00 AM or after 7:00 PM or on legal holidays unless you have invited them to come outside that time frame. On very rare occasions, individuals may pose as solicitors for illegitimate purposes. The police department strongly encourages residents to

ensure those who come to your door are properly identified with a North Salt Lake Solicitor ID Badge prominently displayed, and that those solicitors are following the City's adopted guidelines. No solicitor can get their license without disclosing their true identity, providing a copy of their criminal history, and describing the nature of their business. **The police department strongly encourages residents to call us if they suspect anyone coming to their door is in violation of these requirements.** Our hope is to ensure that residents and businesses remain safe and protected, and that those who desire to solicit their products do so in a safe and legal manner.

South Davis Metro Fire Chief Jim Rampton has issued an order restricting discharge of fireworks, open burning, and the use of any ignition source east

of Orchard Drive in NSL (including homes on the east side of Orchard). This is a precaution we are taking in an attempt to prevent fires in the City.

Introducing: Salt Lake Community Solar



Voles in Foxboro

We are aware that there is a vole problem in Foxboro. We have discussed it at length with staff, Mayor, and City Council. We have enlisted the help of the USDA, who

will be coming out on July 9th, 10th, and 11th to supervise the placement of oats with a toxin fatal to rodents in the vole holes on City property in the area. The holes will then

be buried. We encourage residents to use extreme caution when dealing with vole control chemicals, and suggest enlisting the help of a pest control professional.
