Community Covenant Signing and 9-11 Memorial Concert by 23rd Army Band



Center Street Construction Update

After months of water and gas line replacements, the concrete pavement is finally being installed on the south side of Center Street. ACME Construction is now pouring the concrete pavement on the south side of Center Street from the I-15 overpass to Highway 89. This should be completed around August 31. The concrete will then have to cure for two weeks before traffic will be allowed to use it, so around September 14 the traffic will be moved from the Hatch Park parking lot to the new concrete. Since this is just the south side of the street, the lanes will be narrow – only 11 feet wide. Please use caution and drive slowly during this period. The good news is that traffic will be able to drive through the length of the project after the 14th– from I-15 to Highway-89. The old power poles will also be removed, and once that is completed the contractor will begin installing curb and concrete pavement on the north side of the street. The goal is to have the entire project completed by mid to late October. In the meantime, remember that the only traffic movements that are available are Center Street west of Main Street and Main Street north of Center Street. The detour is 350 North Street from Main to Highway 89. We thank you for your patience.



Take Action: Safe Pesticide Use

Verify license numbers on the UDAF website:

webapp.ag.utah.gov/LicenseLookup/

First, be sure your applicator and their employer are properly licensed by the UDAF. Their license number (prefix 4000-) is required on both sides of the service truck/trailer. You can also ask to see their license, which they are required to have on hand when making applications. Second, be proactive. If you are planning an application, notify your neighbors. If you see an applicator preparing to make an application near your property, bring your children and pets inside and keep them there until the spray is dry. You can also ask to view a copy of the pesticide label. If you suspect that a loss was caused by a pesticide, call the UDAF immediately at (801) 538-7185. It is critical that they collect evidence themselves as soon as possible, because pesticides break down quickly.



Vole Treatment in Foxboro

The City will be working with the USDA again this October to treat City property in the Foxboro for voles. Exact treatment dates will be determined by weather conditions. Stay tuned for further vole updates.
