

The City is in the process of installing a new irrigation line and completing a reservoir expansion project at Deer Hollow Park. Another project in the Eaglewood area is the installation of a water line to provide secondary water to the golf course.



## \*<u>Amended\*</u> Notice of Election and Filing

#### \*ATTENTION ALL WATER USERS\*

We need everyone's help this summer in water conservation. The City's culinary water system struggles to keep up with demand during the summer months. This is due to the fact that only a small percentage of the city is on secondary water. We need everyone to look at ways to cut down on the amount of water that is used such as:

#### **Outdoor Water**

- -If you see isolated brown spots in the lawn, spot irrigate them instead of just simply increasing the cycle time for that station.
- -Deep soak your lawn. Water the lawn long enough for the moisture to soak down into the roots. A light sprinkling will encourage shallow root systems.
- -Water your lawn only when it needs it. Step on the grass. If it springs back up it doesn't need water. If it stays flat, the lawn is ready for watering.
- -Do not water during the day when evaporation is high. Do not water when it is windy.

#### **Indoor Water**

- -Check for small drips from your faucet and replace. Small leaks can waste 20 gallons per day, while larger ones can waste hundreds of gallons.
- -Don't use the toilet as a wastebasket. On most toilets, that's 5 to 7 gallons.
- -Install water-saving shower heads.
- -Take shorter showers. A four-minute shower uses 20 to 40 gallons.
- -Use your dishwasher and clothes washer only for full loads.

In addition, Weber Basin Water Conservancy District is a great resource in helping residents conserve water. They offer free water tests on individual irrigation systems to determine how much water the irrigation system is putting out, the infiltration of water into the soil, and the distribution uniformity. They also check soil type, root depth and sprinkler pressure. The entire process takes about an hour. The water check program is a free service that is offered from May to August. To schedule an appointment, call 801 77-1677. Weber Basin also offers a variety of free classes including fruit tree basics, do-it-yourself backyard firepits, colorful planters and do-it-yourself paver patios to name a few.
