



A note from Police Chief Craig Black:

Dear Residents:

Thank you for all the support this community shows for the members of the police department. We appreciate the community involvement and partnerships with our neighborhood watch members, North Salt Lake Uniting Neighbor's Organization, as well as many of our outstanding businesses.

As summer approaches, the department would like to remind all of our residents that with warmer weather, property crime seems to increase. We regularly see an increase in vehicle thefts, home burglaries, and other petty theft issues that become costly and contribute to a sense of vulnerability we want to avoid in this great city. A few suggestions the police department would like to offer that can assist in preventing crime are:

- 1) Please don't leave valuables unattended in your vehicles when parked outside a secure garage. This includes loose change, phones, credit or debit cards, mail, purses/wallets, music players, or any other items that a thief may see and take the opportunity to steal.
- 2) Don't leave keys, even if hidden, in your vehicle. North Salt Lake continues to see a relatively high rate of auto theft compared to other cities in Davis County. Many of the auto thefts reported each year are cars stolen out of driveways or even garages, where the car keys were left in the automobile.
- 3) Please keep your garage doors closed when you are not around your garage, especially at night. An open garage door is an inviting target to a thief looking to steal property that can be difficult to track and easy to dispose. Remind your neighbors if you see them leaving garage doors open to shut them. The police officers have been told by suspects arrested for thefts how easy homes are to burglarize through open garage doors.
- 4) Be aware of who is in your neighborhood. Get to know your neighbors and be willing to watch out for each other. When you see someone suspicious, **please don't hesitate to call the police.** We would rather talk to someone who has legitimate business in a neighborhood than respond to a burglary later on. If you find solicitors at your door, ask to see their solicitor license. If they don't have one, call the police to check them out. At the very least, we will inform them of what is required to solicit door to door in North Salt Lake.
- 5) Consider getting involved in a neighborhood watch group. None of our neighborhoods are immune from being targeted by criminals. An active neighborhood watch is a proven deterrent to crime and has resulted in the arrests of many criminals. It can be as simple as hosting a neighborhood meeting, barbeque, or other activity where crime or suspicious activities are shared and neighbors know what to watch out for. The police department will be glad to send an officer to any scheduled meeting to provide crime statistics for that area and take information back to the rest of the department to ensure we are more effective in our patrols and investigations.
