Election Information

A Municipal Election will be held this year to elect (3) three City Council Members. Citizens desiring to run for office must file a "Declaration of Candidacy" in person with the North Salt Lake City Recorder. The forms will be available in the office of the City Recorder beginning Friday, July 1, 2011. The filing period will run July 1st through July 15th, 2011, Monday - Friday, 7:00 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. A candidate must have been a resident of North Salt Lake City for at least 12 months (365 days) immediately prior to the date of the election. All candidates must be a current registered voter of North Salt Lake City.

VITA Program

The Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) program is for persons with low to moderate incomes (those with annual incomes of \$49,000 and below). This past tax season was the third year that Davis County has had its own coalition overseeing the program.


Officers of the Year

Three of our officers have been recognized for outstanding achievements in 2010. The Bountiful Elks Club recognized Sergeant Cade Veigel and Corporal Curtis Everett for their efforts in DARE and Gang Enforcement respectively. Corporal Mark Nelson was recognized by his peers in the police department as the outstanding officer of the year.

Sergeant Veigel was recognized as the DARE officer of the Year in Davis County. He is currently the only officer in the department that teaches the DARE program. He teaches these classes to several hundred students each year at Orchard and Foxboro Elementary Schools. Sergeant Veigel has proven himself to be a popular teacher and mentor to our children in this community as he helps them understand the lures, dangers and pitfalls of substance abuse.

Corporal Everett was recognized by the Bountiful Elks as the North Salt Lake Police Department Officer of the Year. He is the only Gang Enforcement Officer in South Davis County, and as such has been very busy. He has been in this assignment for about a year, and during this time

NORTH SALT LAKE: 2010 HAPPY FACTS, YEAR END REPORT

Below is a snapshot of data collected regarding North Salt Lake solid waste and recycling activities for January 2010 -December 2010.

SOLID WASTE: 5,068 TONS • RECYCLING: 531 TONS • TOTAL: 5,599 TONS
TOTAL WASTE DIVERTED FROM LANDFILL: 531 TONS OR 9.48%

ESTIMATED ENVIRONMENTAL BENEFIT BASED ON SINGLE STREAM RECYCLING TONNAGE¹

SAVED > 9,000 Trees which equates to 111,000,000 sheets of newspaper.

SAVED > 2,177,000 KW-hr of Electricity. Enough power for the annual energy needs of 180 homes.

SAVED > 12,700 Gallons of Gasoline.

SAVED > 3,710,000 Gallons of Water. Enough water to meet the daily fresh water needs of 40,000 Americans.

SAVED > 245,000 Gallons of Oil.
