### ELECTION TIME IS NEAR

We have 3 Council Member seats up for election this year and 5 who have filed a Declaration of Candidacy form for those positions. If you have moved, be sure to register no later than October 24<sup>th</sup> by picking up a registration form at the City office, or in the white pages of your phone book, or online at [www.vote.utah.gov](http://www.vote.utah.gov).

### Are You Registered To Vote?

The last day to register in person at the county clerk's office is Monday, October 24<sup>th</sup>. If you have not registered, you can vote provisionally during early voting or the General Election. The county will then automatically register you to vote in the next election.



### Absent-Voter Ballots

If you are unable to vote on November 8th, you can vote early or fill out an application for an absent-voter ballot. The last day to apply for an absent-voter ballot and to cast an absent-voter ballot in-person is November 4th. Voters may still submit absentee ballots by mail if the ballots are postmarked before November 8<sup>th</sup> and received before the canvass on November 15<sup>th</sup>.

## VOTER I.D. REQUIRED!

Please remember – you **MUST** show voter identification. A valid Utah driver license is one of the forms of identification that is sufficient by itself. The law does not require that the address on the license be current. The following are also sufficient by themselves: a photo I.D. card issued by the State of Utah or a branch, department, or agency of the United States; a Utah permit to carry a concealed weapon; a United States passport; and a tribal identification card with or without a photograph.

A photo identification card, such as a driver license, issued by another state is not sufficient by itself. If a voter does not have a form of identification that is sufficient by itself, the voter must have two forms of identification that show the voter's name, and at least one of those forms must show the voter's current address. A driver license issued by another state along with another form of identification such as a current utility bill or bank statement, are sufficient if both show the voter's name, and at least one shows the voter's current address.

The following are also sufficient in combination as long as each shows the voter's name and at least one shows the voter's current address: a certified birth certificate; a valid Social Security card; a check issued by the state or federal government, a paycheck from the voter's employer; a valid Utah hunting or fishing license; a certified copy of court records showing an adoption or name change; a valid Medicaid, Medicare or Electronic Benefits Transfer Card; and an identification card issued by a local government, employer, or college or university within Utah; a current Utah vehicle registration; among other things.
