I-15 Construction from NSL to Farmington

Construction began in April along I-15 to add express lanes in both directions from the north I-215 interchange to U.S. 89/Park Lane in Farmington. Bridges will be replaced at 2600 South, 1500

South, 500 South and 400 North. The interchanges at 2600 South and 500 South are being reconfigured to improve mobility. The project will also improve active transportation with pedestrian facilities at 500

South, 400 North and a new pedestrian bridge at Parrish Lane. Construction is expected to conclude in Summer 2015. Stay informed!

Discover the Trails of North Salt Lake

Have you experienced the city’s great trails? There are paths for all abilities, various distances, and even a commuter trail for cycling into Salt Lake City.

The Short Trails:

- **Bamberger “Rails to Trail Parkway”** is one of the first trails created in NSL. It is located along Hwy. 89 and is .85 miles long.
- **Foxboro Wetlands Loop Trail**, established around the city’s designated wetlands, provides a 1.5 mile loop for the jogger/walker, and is accessible from Cutler, Foxhollow or Foxboro Drives. You can also access the Legacy Parkway Trail on the west side of the loop.
- NEW this year, the **Art Gregerson Memorial Trail** was constructed in 2013 thanks to a donation by the Gregerson family. This trail is adjacent to the geological open space, and is accessed at the south end of Springhill Drive. The trail loop is .5 miles.

- **Wild Rose Loop Trail**, part of the Wild Rose Trail, begins at Wild Rose Trailhead Park (650 East Skycrest Lane). The loop is 1.7 miles. This trail is used by hikers and mountain bike enthusiasts and has designated downhill bike flow trails.

The Commuter Trails:

- **Center Street Trail** can be accessed on the south side of Center Street at I-15 and currently ends at Redwood Road. The trail is scheduled to extend to Legacy Parkway later this year.
- **Legacy Parkway Trail-Jordan River Parkway**, established as a bike, jogging and walking trail, allows commuters to get from NSL’s west side to downtown SLC. The Jordan River Parkway Trail enters NSL at its south boundary and continues north where it connects to Legacy Parkway at the tunnel under I-215.

From there, it becomes the Legacy Parkway Trail that extends the entire length of the city. Both trails are part of regional trail systems, and when complete, will extend from the headwaters of the Jordan River at Utah Lake, to Northern Davis County.

- **HWY 89-Commuter Trail** starts at the intersection of Eagleridge Drive and Hwy.89. The trail is an 8-foot wide paved trail that parallels the frontage road extending south into SLC.
- **Bonneville Shoreline Trail** (and extension trail) is a trail established alongside Eagleridge Drive and continues south along Eaglepointe Drive. The true trail starts at Tunnel Springs Park and proceeds south through the open space and into SLC.

Construction Update

- I-15 Interchange @ 2600 South:** UDOT has begun their I-15 reconstruction project. The first phase will include removing the existing bridge at 2600 S. and replacing it. This will not impact traffic along 1100 North /2600 South during daytime hours; however, there will be occasional closures for east-west traffic along 2600 South during nighttime hours. There will be detour signs posted for the route to 1500 South in Woods Cross. Additionally, UDOT will be widening I-15 from the I-215 interchange in NSL to Farmington in both north and south directions. The lane widths along I-15 in these areas will be narrowed during the project, and there could be some lane closures during nighttime hours. Alternate routes will be US-89 and Legacy Parkway.
- 1100 N. Reconstruction:** 1100 North from Redwood Rd. to the UPRR/UTA tracks at 80 East will be reconstructed, beginning in May. During this time, access will be limited to local traffic only. We encourage all non-resident motorists to avoid that area. Detours for east-west traffic will be Center Street or 1500 South in Woods Cross. In addition, it will be necessary to shut down the entire street for a two-week period sometime this summer. The anticipated completion date is late October.
- Street Asphalt Preservation:** Several streets in the City will receive asphalt preservation surface treatments, commonly known as slurry seals, beginning in May or June. Affected residents will be notified in advance so as to be minimally inconvenienced by street closures (usually lasting two days). Once completed, the treatments should smooth out roadway travel and add years of life to the streets, thereby delaying more expensive reconstructions.
- Street Reconstructions:** Several streets are past the point of surface treatment and now require more extensive reconstructions. Again, affected residents will be notified in advance so as to be minimally inconvenienced by street closures. The roads scheduled for reconstruction, as well as the contractor awarded the job, are listed below:
 - Center St. (between Hwy. 89 and Orchard Dr.)
 - Elk Hollow Rd. (from Cove Cir. to NSL City boundary) and Cove Cir.
 - Lofty Ln. (Eagleridge Dr. to 555 S. Lofty Ln.), Hidden Ln. and Hidden Cir.
- Springhill Landslide Area:** The final phase of the project, stabilization of the site, is complete. An open channel now captures spring water from several sources and safely directs it into the city's storm drain system. The site has been graded and seeded for native plants which should aid in providing long-term stabilization to the site.
