Construction

Union Pacific to Close Railroad Crossing June 1–5

Union Pacific will be closing Center Street at their railroad tracks just west of I-15 beginning Sunday, June 1 through Thursday, June 5. The tracks

have settled and trains currently have to slow to two mph through this intersection. If nothing is done, trains will have to decrease their speed further, resulting in

longer traffic delays for cars. Detour signs will be in place diverting traffic to 1100 North between Main Street and 400 West. Please drive with caution and obey all signs.



Get E-mail Updates on 1100 N. Construction

The 1100 N. Reconstruction project has commenced. Work began near Redwood Rd. and will move eastward. Local traffic only

will be allowed in the construction zones; however, businesses will have continuous access. As major impacts to 1100 North are

I-15 Interchange @ 2600 South

UDOT has started its I-15 reconstruction project. The first phase will include replacing the 2600 S. bridge. This will not impact daytime traffic along 1100 North /2600 South; however, there will be occasional closures for

east-west traffic along 2600 South during the night. Detour signs will be posted for the route to 1500 South in Woods Cross. Additionally, UDOT will be widening I-15 from the I-215 interchange in NSL to Farmington both north and south directions. The

lane widths along I-15 in these areas will be narrowed during the project, and there could be some lane closures during nighttime hours. Alternate routes will be US-89 and Legacy Parkway.



Street Asphalt Preservation

Several streets in the City will receive asphalt preservation surface treatments, commonly known as slurry seals. These projects should be done in a

couple of weeks. Affected residents will be notified in advance so as to be minimally inconvenienced by street closures (usually lasting two days). Once

completed, the treatments should smooth roadway travel and add years of life to the streets, thereby delaying more expensive reconstructions.



City Street Reconstruction

Several streets are past the point of surface treatment and now require more extensive reconstructions. Again, affected residents will be notified in advance so as to be minimally

inconvenienced by street closures. The roads scheduled for reconstruction, are listed below: Center St. (between Hwy. 89 and Orchard Dr.) – starting early July. Elk Hollow Rd. (from Cove Cir. to

NSL City boundary) and Cove Cir. – starting early to mid-July. Lofty Ln. (Eagleridge Dr. to 555 S. Lofty Ln.), Hidden Ln. and Hidden Cir. - starting early June.

What is NSL Live?
