Construction

1100 N. Construction Update

As part of the 1100 N. reconstruction project, 1100 N. will be closed at the UPRR/UTA tracks from **July 25 to August 14**. A detour route going from Overland Street to

Pacific Avenue to Main Street and back to 1100 N. will be installed. Expect heavy delays, and please avoid this area if possible. As major impacts to 1100 N. are expected through

I-15 Interchange @ 2600 South

Portions of the old bridge at 2600 South over I-15 will be demolished during the nights of **August 1 and 2**. 2600 South will be closed to east/west traffic under the bridge from 10:00 pm

to 5:00 am nightly during demolition. The I-15 interchange will remain open. I-15 traffic can use 500 South and local traffic can use 1500 South as alternate routes. When complete, this

project will result in improved east/west mobility as well as add express lanes in both directions from the north I-215 interchange to U.S. 89/Park Lane in Farmington.



City Street Reconstruction

Many of the city's summer street projects are complete, and we appreciate the patience of our great residents. Remaining projects include

the reconstruction of Elk Hollow Rd. (from Cove Circle to the NSL City boundary) and Cove Circle. The road will be open to one-way traffic through the majority of the construction, but

residents are encouraged to avoid this area if possible. The work is being performed by Hughes General Contractors and is expected to be complete by the middle of August.

Water

Reminder: No Outside Watering Between 10 am and 6 pm.

Free Water Use Testing: Did you know Weber Basin Water Conservancy District will come to your home and check your water use? They will review usage by evaluating your sprinklers, your soil, etc. This is a great opportunity for residents to assist in water conservation efforts. Call for your free check: 801-771-1677. Conservation: Take time to set up your sprinkler timer to water appropriately for the season. When landscaping, consider xeriscaping, which uses low-water-use plants. In hard to water areas, such as park strips and steep slopes, try planting drought-tolerant and regionally adapted plants. There are also many ornamental grasses which require very little water and are easy to care for. Visit Weber Basin's Learning Garden in Layton for landscape ideas and watering plans for your type of irrigation.

Free Classes: The Learning Garden offers free classes including their "Project Super Saturday" Aug. 3 where you can learn to build arbors (9:00 am), Artificial Grass and Putting Greens (10:00 am) and Water Features (11:00 am). For a full class schedule go to www.weberbasin.com/conservation.

Family Meals – An Investment in Your Child’s Future

Did you know that simply eating regular meals together as a family can help you raise healthier, more well-adjusted children? September is Family Meals Month, and Davis County Health Dept. is encouraging families everywhere to make time to eat together. Breakfast, lunch or dinner...even a few meals a week can make a difference!

Family meal time allows children to bond with the family, and to watch and learn skills, values, and habits from the family environment. Children from families who eat together five or more times a week, generally eat more fruits and vegetables, are more likely to make healthier choices when they are on their own, are better able to manage negative emotions, and more often learn appropriate ways to

share thoughts, feelings, and opinions. Other long-term benefits include being more likely to make As and Bs in school, having a larger vocabulary, and being more likely to avoid drug and alcohol use.
