Eaglepointe Landslide Update

At approximately 6:30 am August 5, the city experienced a landslide in the Eaglepointe Phase 18 development above Parkway Drive. No one was injured, but one home was destroyed and several others evacuated. The slide came as severe thunderstorms hit Utah that week, and nobody predicted the heavy rain that

came down overnight. The city has been working with utility companies and the developers of this area to mitigate further damage and repair the slide. The city has suspended development affected by the landslide until it can ensure it is safe. Sky Properties has donated a building lot to the family who lost their home and has invited others who

have benefited from NSL developments to "pay it forward" and contribute time, labor, materials, money, etc. to get this family back into their home quickly. Elk hollow Road will have one-way traffic daily through the first part of September.

1100 N. Construction Update

Construction continues in the area of 1100 North (from Redwood Road to 110 East). Road closures and detour routes

change rapidly, so please slow down, watch for flaggers and obey their instructions. As major impacts to 1100 N. are expected

I-15 Reconstruction

Expect multiple lane closures on I-15 at night in both directions through mid-September. Single lane closures will begin at 9:00 p.m. with I-15 restricted to one lane in each direction by midnight. This will allow space for asphalt removal

and replacement, concrete pavement rehabilitation, and bridge rehabilitation at multiple locations. Crews continue to rehabilitate the I-15 bridges over Center St. and Main St. in NSL. Construction activities continue

on 500 South near I-15 including soil stabilization efforts for the new bridge. Travel lanes are narrowed to 11'. Per city ordinance, trucks are restricted from using Center Street and Main Street in North Salt Lake

School Bus Safety

The kids are back in school. Here are some tips to keep our children safe. Walk with your kids to the bus stop and wait with them until it arrives. Tell kids to stand at least three giant steps back from the curb as the bus approaches and board the bus one at a time.

- Teach kids to wait for the bus to come to a complete stop before getting off and never to walk behind the bus.
- If your child needs to cross the street after exiting the

bus, he or she should take five giant steps in front of the bus, make eye contact with the bus driver and cross when the driver indicates it's safe.

- Teach kids to look left, right and left again before crossing the street.
- Instruct younger kids to use handrails when boarding or exiting the bus. Be careful of straps or drawstrings that could get caught in the door.
- If your children drop something, they should tell the bus driver and make sure

the bus driver is able to see them before they pick it up.

- Drivers should always follow the speed limit and slow down in school zones and near bus stops.
- Remember to stay alert and look for kids who may be trying to get to or from the school bus.
- Slow down and stop if you're driving near a school bus that is flashing yellow or red lights. This means the bus is either preparing to stop (yellow) or already stopped (red) and children are getting on or off.
