

Note from Police Chief Craig Black

The police department has taken several recent reports regarding residents and business being victimized by criminals obtaining funds, or access to funds, by a variety of deceptive phone tactics. Some of these criminals have posed as representatives of the power company, or the IRS, or claiming they represent a distressed family member, and many other deceptions. The bottom line is that these criminals are asking for money to be sent to them, or requesting access to personal information like Social Security numbers, bank account numbers, credit card numbers, etc.

The police would like to remind everyone that you should never disclose personal information to someone who initiates the contact. Whether it is by phone, e-mail, or in person, always verify who is making the request by calling or otherwise contacting a known, verifiable contact at the agency or company requesting the information. Unfortunately, many of these scammers are located out of the United States and are beyond the reach of local law enforcement. If the contact is made by a door-to-door solicitor, please call the police if there is any question as to the legitimacy of what they are doing. If the contact is made by phone or e-mail, hang-up/delete the email, and contact the agency that the caller claims to represent to verify the authenticity of the contact. If you have given information or money and think you have been the victim of this type of fraud, the police can still take a report and assist in providing resource information about protecting future loss and credit damage. **PLEASE PROTECT YOURSELF BY NEVER GIVING INFORMATION TO A CALLER WHO YOU CANNOT VERIFY IS AUTHENTICALLY REPRESENTING A LEGITIMATE COMPANY.**

Winter Reminders

Overnight street parking is prohibited between 11:00 pm and 6:00 am from November 1 through April 1. Also, **Property owners are required to trim the trees** on the parkway of their homes so the

snow plows can clear the roadway without damaging the vehicles. Trees, or other growth, must be trimmed eleven feet (11') above the street or seven feet (7') above the sidewalk.

Avoid frozen pipes. Leave one faucet running slightly during extreme temperatures. This could save you and the city time and money.
