Minutes:

1. Disc Golf (with Darcy Papenfuss)
Darcy Papenfuss went over hand-outs that she provided. Matt Jensen said they could put one cage up in a park for people to throw their discs in but people who are really into disc golf want nine holes with a more established course. Darcy said that if the committee decided to put up just a few cages then she was thinking they could be put along the sides of the park, trees or along a gravel path. Darcy also talked about some of the poles being removable with padlocks. Natalie Gordon would love to see a nine hole disc golf put in but wants to make sure we could do it at the right location. Matt said that he went to the Army Corp of Engineers and asked if they could put a nine hole disc golf at the wetlands and they said no. Matt said another option could be if you go

south across the border from Davis County into Salt Lake County there is a beautiful area along the Bountiful Shoreline Trail where you could put seven holes with two of the holes beginning at Tunnel Springs Park to make a nine hole disc golf course. It was suggested that the committee and Darcy contact Salt Lake County to get their thoughts on the disc golf idea. Conrad mentioned the perimeter around Hatch Park could also be looked at along with the parkway along Highway 89 with Mathis Park. Darcy said that three cages would be a good number at Tunnel Springs Park. Matt brought up the possibility of having a city wide disc golf with two holes being played at each park.

Darcy said she would e-mail the disc golf information to Sally.

**Angie Parker came to talk about the petition for tennis courts at Legacy Park. Angie said she went to City Council in September and they suggested that she come to this meeting to share her findings. Angie stated the reasons why she felt like tennis courts are needed in the Foxboro community:*

- 1. Would enhance the park in the Foxboro community.*
- 2. There are no tennis courts within walking distance.*
- 3. The closest tennis courts are at Hatch Park which are run down and are by the freeway.*
- 4. There is a large area of land in the Foxboro area for tennis courts.*

Conrad Jacobson and Jon Rueckert said there is only enough room for one single court at Legacy Park. Conrad mentioned that with only one court it would not be considered a destination court. Natalie Gordon said the HOA in their neighborhood has an area that is large enough for two tennis courts. The HOA will be handed over to the residents on November 18th and it could be a possibility after the changeover. Becky Edwards brought up the idea of the city being involved with that area so that all residents would be able to use the tennis courts. Matt mentioned that he is not interested in putting one single tennis court at Legacy Park but would rather find an area to put two tennis courts in to justify the money spent for the construction. Natalie said she feels like if the old tennis courts are not playable then they will need to be fixed first.

Jon Rueckert said that he looked into the cost to restripe the tennis courts and it would come in around ten thousand dollars. It was decided to hold off until the spring to stripe the tennis courts because of weather.

Steve Aase summarized by saying we will wait and see what happens with the HOA changeover for an option. The committee will not move forward with a one tennis court at Legacy Park. The striping for tennis courts and pickle ball at Hatch Park will be delayed until spring.

- 2. Skateboard park location options: Legacy vacancy

- 3. 3K Run for Your Life, review*

Conrad Jacobson was disappointed in the turn out. There were approximately 60-65 people. Matt Jensen said the people who participated had a lot of fun. He also mentioned the people who loved it last year, did not come this year. Steve Aase suggested posting pictures of all former events on the website and newsletter to draw more attention. It was also thought that having the event on UEA weekend might have brought the attendance down.

Matt Jensen went over the cost of the event for participants. To pre-register before the race was \$8.00 an individual (with shirt) and day of event an individual was \$10.00 (with shirt), families are \$30.00 (comes with 3 shirts) and to purchase a shirt was \$5.00. Steve Aase brought up Peach Jar that will advertise North Salt Lake events for free if there is no fee involved. The fees involved with the event this year was as follows: t-shirts was \$460.00, the DJ was \$150.00, the advertising was \$50.00 and refreshments were \$50.00. Conrad Jacobson suggested a no cost Halloween Run for next year.

Matt Jensen said that he will no longer be the head of this event. He suggested that someone else needs to head the Halloween Run for next year or this event will no longer take place.

Natalie Gordon suggested a change of venue for the Halloween Run such as Hatch Park or Legacy Park and the run would be free with the only cost being the t-shirts. Steve Aase brought up the fields at Legacy Park that are still used in October with soccer and lacrosse teams.

4. Write newsletter survey for December issue
Camille Thorpe said she will have the long survey in for the December newsletter.

5. Committee by-laws reviewed: Parks, Trails, Arts & Recreation
 - a. Committee mission defined
Camille Thorpe said she would like to postpone this discussion until the next meeting. Camille asked Sally to e-mail a copy of the ordinance with the changes.
 - b. Itemize attributes of success
Conrad Jacobson said there were a lot of events this year and there has been good feedback and comments on all the events. Matt Jensen said that people feel good about the activities in the city even though they might not participate in everything.
 - c. List each NSL Live event in 2014 (Budget \$14,000.00)
Steve Aase went over the events and amount spent on each as follows:
 - *Kite Festival - \$2,000.00*
 - *Arbor Day – Question on whether or not this is an NSL Live event?*
 - *Children’s Theater - \$1,500.00*
 - *Three Kings Bicycle Race - \$3,900.00*
 - *July 3rd 5K Run - \$3,100.00 (separate budget)*
 - *Festival of Speed (separate budget)*
 - *NSL Reads - \$900.00*
 - *Halloween 3K Run for Your Life - \$700.00*
 - *Concerts – Steve Aase said there was nothing submitted for expenses.**Steve said the budget looks good for this year, especially with all the events that were put on.*

November 18th is City Council and NSL Live meeting will be held on November 25th.

**NSL Reads – Lori Seppi contacted the Bountiful Theater as well as Legacy Crossing. Unbroken comes out on December 25th and is rated PG13. At the Legacy Crossing theater December 30th*

(Tuesday evening) is available with a theater of 129 seats at a cost of \$774.00 also Saturday morning for discount time and the cost would be \$7.75 per person with a minimum of 75 people. Lori said she would like to charge the participant \$5.00 a ticket and have the city help subsidize the cost. There would be no other extra activities.

After discussion of different options it was decided to inform people that the movie "Unbroken" is coming out on December 25th in the newsletter and website and refer it back to NSL Live Reads event. Lori said that it would also be a good way to advertise for NSL Live Reads for next year.

**Second Sunday Concert – Becky Edwards said she will put the event on facebook. Becky said the Pastor from the Bible Church will be giving the sermon with different choirs singing and congregational hymns. Matt Jensen will emcee the event.*

Next meeting will be held on November 25th at 6:00 pm at City Hall.
