Minutes:

1. New Park at Elizabeth Dr & 900 N (Community Open House review).

Jim Spung said they had changed the options from the last time he was here and handed out three new proposed options for the new park. Jim said that option one was overwhelmingly the favorite at the July 9th open house. They will take their comments and hopefully come up with a park that everyone will enjoy. Jim mentioned that the survey also asked for shade for the park and they will go back to the designer with the request. There are fifteen trees in each design and eventually should have a lot of shade but will try to come up with a short term solution. Most of the people like the “unity dome” in option two. Everyone liked the swings, the spinami and the jungle gym (which is in option one). Jim said they will try and come up with an option with those features within budget with a shade solution. No one at the open house wanted a pavilion for this park.

Jim said the next step is to get a final design. They will get with Big T Recreation who is doing most of the design work and get a final drawing and then hand it over to Landscape Architect. G Brown will get the final design for the park. Paul Ottoson mentioned that the park will not be done this year because of time restraints. Jim said they might start the park this year but told residents that it would not be completed until next year. There is a hundred thousand dollar budget for this park and they left a ten thousand dollar buffer for unexpected expenses. Option one came in at a total of ninety-two thousand and that is without a buffer. Option two was eighty-nine thousand with an eleven thousand dollar buffer and option three came in at eighty-eight thousand with a twelve thousand dollar buffer. Camille Thorpe asked what budget it came out from and Paul Ottoson said that the City was given a check for one hundred thousand dollars from the developer.

Camille asked about a name for the park and Matt Jensen said that pocket parks are not named. Tayler Clough asked if they ever have had donations given from an individual and had the park named after the person. The response was that they had not had personal donations for any park in the City of North Salt Lake. Conrad Jacobson mentioned that they had talked about naming the pocket park in the last Council meeting and the consensus was they would not name the park. Steve Aase asked if there would be any more parks built in the City. Matt Jensen said there is not any plans at this time for any new parks but could happen in the future.

2. Hatch Park – Pickleball/Basketball update cost and timeline.

Matt Jensen said in the last City Council meeting they voted to put the pickleball at Hatch Park and talked about fitting two pickleball courts side by side (narrow wise). Jon Rueckert mentioned that he talked to some people who would not recommend that because of the side court is really small. There was also discussion at City Council meeting about a pickleball court at Tunnel Springs Park on the tennis court. Jon said that a regulation pickleball court is 30x60 feet and recommended is 30x64 feet. The actual court itself is 20x44 feet. Camille Thorpe will contact Dennis Harper and Mike Nielsen who came to the March 11th NSL Live meeting to talk about their thoughts on two pickleball courts at Hatch Park. Jon said that the bid to stripe two pickleball courts is one-thousand dollars. Matt Jensen said that they could have as many as four pickleball courts on the tennis courts and one pickleball court on the skateboard park which would be a total of five pickleball courts at Hatch Park.

After discussion the NSL Live Committee decided they would like to recommend to the City Council on August 5th four pickleball courts on the tennis courts and one pickleball court at the skatepark at Hatch Park. It would cost an additional two-thousand dollars on top of the thirteen thousand for the basketball court.

3. Hatch Park – Lighting on flag.

Jon Rueckert said the solar light has been ordered and has enough battery to go from dusk to dawn and should light the flag up well.

**Conrad Jacobson asked about the men's restroom at Hatch Park. Jon said someone broke the toilet off the wall and the restroom had to be closed. The toilet has been ordered but the restroom will remain closed for the holiday. Jon will order a temporary ADA portable restroom to be delivered until the men's restroom is reopened.*

Conrad talked about cameras being installed at Hatch Park because of the vandalism that takes place. Jon said it is hard to make out faces from the cameras and wasn't sure if they could make identification of the vandals.

4. *Veteran's Memorial Amphitheater (Officially named on July 15th). Camille Thorpe said that Veteran's Memorial Amphitheater was official on July 15th at the North Salt Lake Council meeting.*
5. *NSL Live Reads. Tayler Clough asked if the submissions could be pushed back. Lori Seppi said they can but it is written on the posters and they would have to send out e-mails stating they have one more week. It was decided to wait until the submission date and see how many submissions are received before the date is pushed back.*

Lori Seppi said advertising is all done but is looking for volunteers. Lori asked Steve Aase to greet the guest speakers and their families at the door and take them to their seats. Lori asked for volunteers for refreshments and two volunteers for the children's room. She needs someone to hand out the awards for the writing competition and was thinking of the Mayor if he would be willing. Lori also asked for someone who would lead the panel discussion. Natalie Gordon and Tayler Clough's names were mentioned for the panel discussion. Lori will e-mail and ask them.

Lori said the movie is ninety minutes and the panel discussion is about 30 minutes which is two hours to entertain the children. She suggested reading the children's book "The Butterfly", then do the craft and end with the movie "Bedknobs and Broomsticks" which is World War II related. Steve Aase will ask about cookies for refreshments through "Smith's".

Lori said the raffle prizes will be donated by "Barnes and Noble". They will be literary items such as book marks and books. Lori suggested a question box for the raffle. There would be questions for people to fill out and when the question is pulled out of the box and if the answer is right, the person would win a prize. The committee liked the idea and Lori will organize the raffle.

Lori said the City Book Club and Writing Competition is honoring those who sacrificed to bring victory in World War II.

Conrad Jacobson said that Dan Wells is moving into his neighborhood. He is an author who writes horror and science fiction type books. There was discussion about a Halloween type book event or a possibility for next year's book club.

**Matt Jensen mentioned that in October they will be doing the Halloween 3K Run. Last year it was a great event at Tunnel Springs Park with a lot of mothers with their kids in costumes. The date of October 18th was decided on. Last year the bathrooms were not opened and this year Jon Rueckert and Sally Beyer will remind TJ Riley (Parks Superintendent) to have the bathrooms opened.*

**Taylor asked about the July 3rd celebration and if the committee had anything to do with that event. Matt Jensen said at this time they do not. Taylor said he had two things he wanted brought up. The first was the delay in the fireworks and the second was the sprinklers came on at some of the holes at the golf course. Jon Rueckert said he would pass the word on. Conrad Jacobson also asked Jon to make sure the sprinklers would not come on during the "Movie at the Park" night on Saturday, July 26th. Steve Aase suggested they could advertise on Peachjar which is free for those activities that do not charge. Lori asked if NSL Reads went out on Peachjar and Steve said it did.*

NSL Live Arts.

Camille Thorpe would like to put this on August 12th's meeting for further discussion and asked that the committee be thinking of local artists for an open house art gallery for the fall season coming up.

NSL Live Sunday Concert Series; Signage, August 10th, September 21st (3rd Sunday).

**Calliope – TBD – Music by the Freed's on an old circus calliope.*

Camille Thorpe said she talked to Becky Edwards and she said she would look into a bid on election type signs for the Concert Series. There was discussion on different types of banners that could be used. Matt Jensen said that facebook, the website, the newsletter and the electronic signs are a good way to get the word out.

Matt said for the band concert coming up on September 21st, he will ask the Fire Chief to talk about honoring the Military, Police and Fire. Conrad Jacobson suggested we could advertise the concert event on the Davis County Clipper calendar and the Friday edition of the Deseret News.

Camille said that the fiddlers who were going to do the August 10th concert have cancelled. A backup possibility is a Calliope which is music by Dick and Joan Freed. There was some concern and questions about the Calliope. Camille said she will talk to Stan Porter and then go and see the Calliope Thursday and see if this will be a good possibility for the concert.

6. Bike Trail Safety – Recommendations Nola Lucke

Nola Lucke said striping is key from keeping cars separate from the bikes. Nola would like to see the roads better maintained after construction on the roads because of the rocks and pebbles. Nola commented on construction debris on asphalt walking trail adjacent to Highway 89 (possibly left over from pothole repairs). Jon Rueckert said he has run the street sweeper on that trail but it is tight. Nola also brought up Eagleridge Drive with the construction and the rocks that are dropped from the trucks. Jon said they usually hit every street three times a year with the street sweeper. The major streets get done more often.

Nola said that the trail at the Frontage Road has been better this year than it has been in the past. Matt Jensen said that they could request a bike lane on Highway 89 to UDOT as a City and as residents. There are problems with certain areas on Highway 89 that would

not be conducive for a bike lane. Nola also commented that the construction trucks going up Eagleridge are moving over and using the bike lane. Jon Rueckert said that the problem has been discusse. A possible option is to paint a line three feet over from the original line with a bike symbol to see if that would help mark that as a bike lane.

Nola asked if there was a possibility of getting a restroom at Center Street on Legacy with water. Matt Jensen said they have looked into putting vending machines with water and Gatorade but it wasn't feasible.

Jon said the trails are maintained when the snow melts until the snow falls.

7. Advisory Committee Review

Matt Jensen said the City Council revised the charter at the last Council meeting. The NSL Live Committee will no longer be reviewing the events at the parks and trails.

Next meeting will be held on August 12th at 6:00 pm at City Hall.

Camille Thorpe adjourned the meeting at 7:34 pm.
