North Salt Lake History

Mrs. Mathis, acting under the direction of Utah Pioneer and League of Women Voters, compiled a lengthy article on the North Salt Lake history. This article covers items on commercial development, population trends, schools, geographic development and subsequent plans, land classification and topography, early settlers, and city officials.

The following is information verifying usage of the different names for the present community called North Salt Lake. This information is taken, in part, from Mrs. Mathis's records.

The area between the Salt Lake-Davis County line and 5th South Street boundary line in Bountiful, from the mountain line to the Great Salt Lake was settled periodically by early settlers in 1848, along with the Bountiful settlements. This described area was known as South Bountiful, named after the South Bountiful Ward. This name continued for the southern part of the area, until the new establishment of Woods Cross soon became a new nomenclature for most of the area between the present Cudahy Lane (Center Street) and the Bountiful city limits. This territory remained under the Woods Cross post Office until 1954, and much of it still does.

In about 1895, Leary and Warren expanded an old feed yard into a business called the Salt Lake Union Stockyards. This was repurchased in 1906 by Intermountain Packing. The building burned soon after. In 1916 the property was purchased by the present Cudahy Packing Company. The name North Salt Lake was used by this company to designate their location for mailing purposes.

In 1918-19 a small post office by this name was established at the packing plant to serve the business and few families not served by the Woods Cross RFD. This name was adapted to serve the area west of Highway 91 (now called Highway 89) and south of Cudahy Lane.

In about 1891 Harry Joseph acquired this same property. Joseph planted this area in orchards and operated, along with Mr. Odell, a successful fruit shipping business for many years. All legal documents were and have since been designated and documented at St. Joseph's junction, along with the North Salt Lake mailing address.

White and sons acquired the area now known as Hillside Gardens, (date unknown) in the early 1900s and operated a slaughter house. It was known as White's Hill. This was sold in the late 1920s to Lauren Gibbs who subsequently subdivided the area.


Fred Odell acquired all property between Cudahy Lane to approximately 7200 South in the early 1900s. His 80-acre orchard extended west over the Highway and east up the mountain. The orchard was planted in grapes, apple, peach, and apricot trees. Mr. Odell started his own private water system, operating from the springs on White Hill, now owned by North Salt Lake. Mr. Odell shared this water with about 65 families in the area. This part of the area has since been known as Odell or as Odell Orchard.

(Quoted verbatim) "By 1946 the community contained approximately 200 people, and water for culinary purposes had become a major factor in limiting the growth of the town. Action was therefore taken during that year to incorporate a part of the community into a town under the laws of Utah, in order to implement the development of additional culinary water. A petition was circulated and incorporation of the original townsite was completed on Oct. 6, 1954" (Unquote).

The Salt Lake and Ogden Railway Company was established in 1891. It is now known also as the Bamberger Railroad. This company established stations in this area known as St. Joseph junction, (later changed to North Salt Lake).

When the town was organized on October 6, 1946, it adopted the name of North Salt Lake Corporation, relating the post office building adjacent to the Union Pacific Railroad.

In August of 1961, Governor George D. Clyde declared the town of North Salt Lake a third class city. Since that time, several annexations have occurred and the city population has grown to over 16,000.

City Council: Meetings are held the 1st and 3rd Tuesday at 7:00 PM at the North Salt Lake City Hall located 10 East Center Street, in the City Council Chambers. A work session is held at 6:00 PM.

Planning Commission:

Meetings are held the 2nd and 4th Tuesday at 6:30 PM at the North Salt Lake City Hall located at 10 East Center Street.

Justice Court:

North Salt Lake Justice Court, overseen by Judge David Miller, handles traffic violations, minor criminal cases and small claims up to \$10,000. Court is held on most Tuesdays from 9:00 AM – 11:00 AM and 1:00 PM – 5:00 PM on a first come first serve basis. Please call prior to attending to make sure court is in session. Small Claims Court is in session the 1st Tuesday of each month at 8:30 AM. The Clerk’s Office is open Monday-Thursday 7:00 AM to 5:30 PM. The Court and the Clerk’s Office are closed on Friday and Legal Holidays.

Street Parking:

From November 1 to April 1 of any year, no person shall park a vehicle on any street for a period of time longer than thirty (30) minutes between the hours of 11:00 PM and 6:00 AM of any day, and during any period of snowfall when snow plows may be operating. Citations will be issued for these violations.

Utilities:

The City provides Water, Garbage and Recycling collection services to residential customers, with a few exceptions. Please contact the following businesses for other utility services:

North Salt Lake City utility bills are mailed the 15th of each month.

The City has adopted an ordinance restricting outside watering. Watering outside with North Salt Lake water is prohibited between the hours of 10:00 AM and 6:00 PM. Use of sprinkling systems from October 15th through April 15th is prohibited. If an exception to these restrictions is needed, submit an application in writing to the Public Works Director.

The garbage fee is \$12.75 for one can. Extra cans may be ordered for a minimum of 6 months, with a charge for \$10.75 per month for each extra can. Recycling is \$4.10 per month. Garbage will be picked up the day after your normally scheduled day for the following holidays: July 4th, Thanksgiving, Christmas and New Year’s Day. Please place your can on the curb the night before the pickup day with the handle towards the house. See www.nslcity.org for a full list of fees and charges. There is also a spring and fall cleanup. See the City’s web site for more details.

North Salt Lake City Corporation Direct Pay Program is the easy way to pay your utility bill. This systems saves you time and money by:

- ◆ eliminating the need to write a check each month
- ◆ saving postage costs
- ◆ avoiding the need to make a special trip to the City offices to pay your bill

Now you can have your payment automatically withdrawn from your bank account each month.

ENROLLMENT IS SIMPLE.....

To enroll for Direct Pay simply complete the authorization agreement in this pamphlet, sign it, tear it off, and return it, along with a voided check, to North Salt Lake City Corporation.

Direct Pay will first be established approximately 30 days after you sign up, so your current bill must be paid with a regular payment

The Process.....

Your financial institution will automatically withdraw your payment from your account on or about the **15th day of the month**. (If the 15th is a non-business day, payment will be made on the next business day). Beginning the first month that your payment will be withdrawn from your bank account, your bill will indicate "bank payment".


Each month we will continue to read your meter and send you a bill detailing the charges and showing the amount due to be automatically withdrawn from your account.

If there are questions about your billing, please notify North Salt Lake City Corporation immediately so any necessary adjustments can be made before withdraw notification is sent to your financial institution (the City will notify your bank approximately four (4) business days before your direct payment.



Terms and Conditions:

1. The customer may terminate this agreement for any reason whatsoever by giving North Salt Lake City Corporation ("the City") oral or written notice of the agreement's termination. Termination shall not be effective until three business days after the City receives the customer's notice of termination.
2. Should customer desire to place a "stop payment order" on any future debit, the customer may do so by giving the City notice at least four business days before the direct payment.
3. If the customer changes banks or bank accounts and wants to continue using the Direct Pay Program, customer must sign a new authorization agreement.
4. Customer will pay a returned item fee for any automatic debit entry that is returned to the City for insufficient funds.
5. Automatic payments will be debited from the customer's bank account on or about the 15th day of the month. (If the 15th is a non-business day, payment will be made on the next business day).
6. The City will reimburse customer for any amounts wrongfully debited from customer's checking or savings account. The City will not be liable for any other actual, incidental, consequential or special damages resulting from any wrongful debit from the customer's checking or savings account.

Voter Instructions

You may use this form to:

- Register to vote in Utah
- Change your name or address on your voter registration record
- Affiliate with a party or change your party affiliation

To register to vote in Utah, you must:

- Be a citizen of the United States
- Have resided in Utah at least 30 days immediately before the next election
- Be at least 18 years old on or before the next election

Mail-in registration instructions:

- Complete all required information; if not applicable write "N/A"
- If you have registered to vote with a different name or address, complete the change of information section
- **One of the following is required: a Utah Driver License number, a Utah State Identification number, or the last four digits of your Social Security number. If you do not have a Utah Driver License or a Utah State Identification card, please write "None" in the space designated for a Utah Driver License or Utah State Identification and fill in your Social Security number**
- Read the voter declaration and citizenship affidavit and sign and date below
- Mail the form to your county clerk's office (addresses are on the back of this form)

Deadline for submitting this form:

- By Mail: This form must be postmarked at least 30 days before an election to be eligible to vote in that election
- Walk In: This form must be delivered in person to your county clerk at least 15 days before the election to be eligible to vote in that election

If you are qualified and the information on your form is complete, your county clerk will mail confirmation of your voter registration to you


DIRECTIONS

From Salt Lake City

Travel northbound I-15 to exit 312, after approximately 1-mile north on HWY 89 turn right, on Eagle Ridge Drive. Continue up the hill following the main road through Eagle Ridge, up the mountain to the golf course.

From Davis County

Travel Southbound I-15 to exit 315, turn left and travel Eastward up 2600 S. to 500 W. (3rd light). Turn Right and head South approximately half a mile until the road comes to a "T." Turn right onto Orchard Drive and continue traveling South to Eaglewood Drive (2nd light). Turn left and proceed up Eaglewood Drive until you reach the top of the hill where the clubhouse is located.



LOCATION

Nestled in the hills of the Wasatch Front, Eaglewood over looks the Great Salt Lake and west to the Oquirrh mountain range. Conveniently located just seven miles from downtown Salt Lake City and only fifteen minutes from the international airport. COURSE
