SUBJECT: Plat amendment to Lots 1317 & 1318 of the Eaglewood Cove Subdivision, Phase 13 located at 1363 East Wood Oaks Loop

RECOMMENDATION

The Development Review Committee (DRC) recommends approval of the plat amendment for Eaglewood Cove, Phase 13, vacating a public utility easement and combining lots 1317 & 1318, located at 1363 East Wood Oaks Loop with the following condition:

1. Correction of engineering and planner redlines.

BACKGROUND

The buyer of lots 1317 and 1318 desires to combine the lots into one single building lot. Lot 1318 is platted as a flag lot and a public utility easement (pue) exists along the shared property line between the two lots. The amended lot relocates the public utility easement to the side property line. Notification has been sent to affected entities. No public comment has been received regarding the proposed vacation.

The proposed building envelope excludes the lot area over 30% in slope on the upper portion of the lot and additionally preserves the existing scrub oak on the hillside. A review of the geotechnical study, the new building envelope, and the proposed site plan and final grading plan for the home have been completed by the City Engineer and City Geotechnical consultant and have been found to be in accordance with the approved study.

The amended lot 1317A will be subject to the same requirements and plat notes from the original plat, as well as the recorded covenants for the subdivision. There are a few minor planning redline corrections outstanding which relate to the outline numbering of the plat notes. The City Engineer will verify the minor engineering corrections related to the legal description prior to recordation.

POSSIBLE MOTION

I move that the Planning Commission recommend to the City Council approval of the plat amendment combining Eaglewood Cove Subdivision, Phase 13, lots 1317 and 1318 and vacating a public utility easement on the property located at 1363 East Wood Oaks Loop with the following condition:

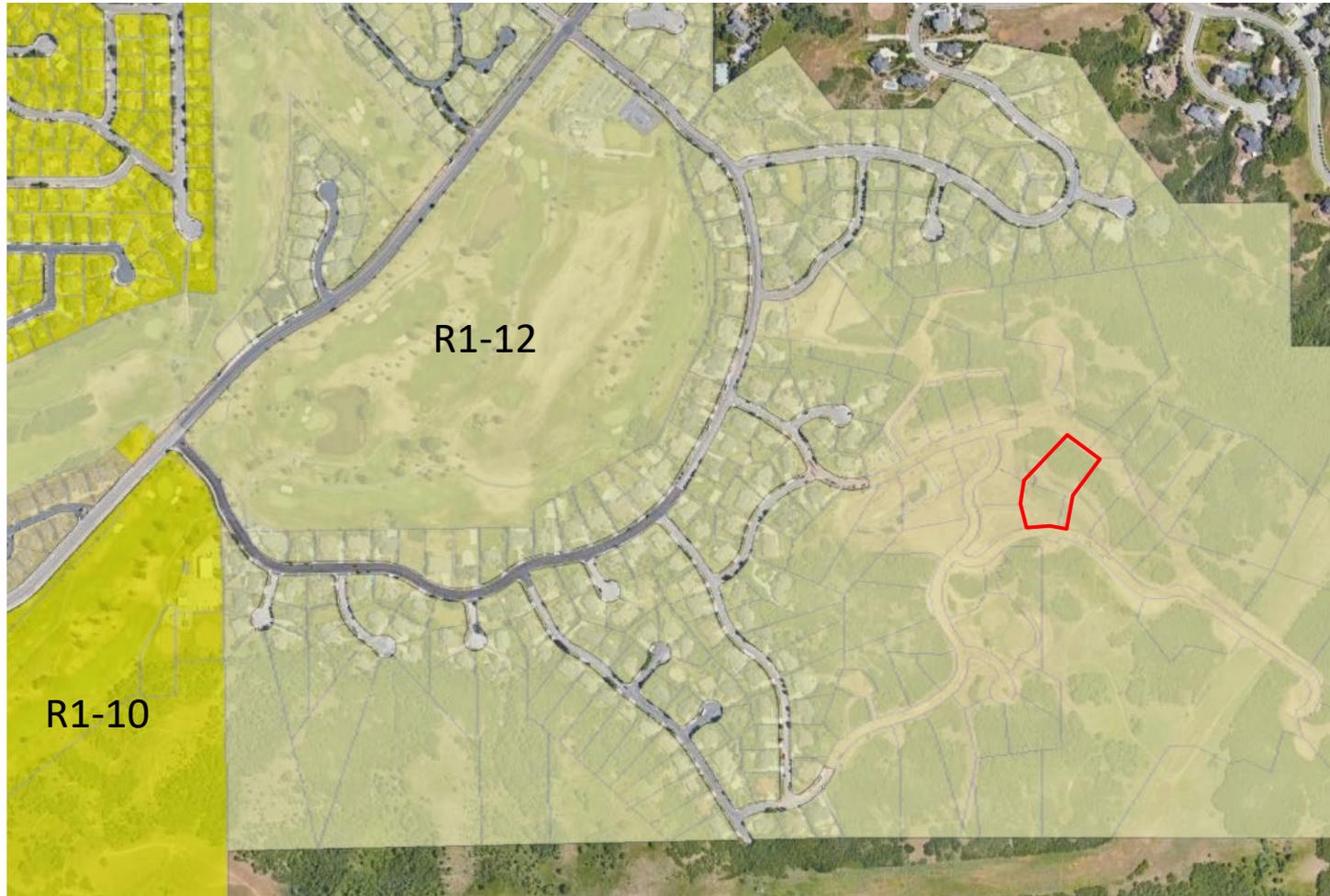

Aerial/Zoning






 - BUILDING LOTS:** THE CRITICAL SLOPE EASEMENT SHALL APPLY TO ALL THOSE PORTIONS OF EACH BUILDING LOT WHERE THE SLOPE IS GREATER THAN THIRTY PERCENT (30%) AND ALL AREAS OUTSIDE THE DESIGNATED BUILDING ENVELOPE.  - UTILITY EASEMENTS IN CRITICAL SLOPE EASEMENT AREAS.** UTILITY EASEMENTS WITHIN THE CRITICAL SLOPE EASEMENT AREAS ARE LIMITED TO THOSE DESIGNATED ON THE PLAT FOR THE INSTALLATION, CONSTRUCTION, MAINTENANCE, REPAIR, AND REPLACEMENT OF ANY UTILITY SERVICES AND UTILITY LINES WHICH SERVE THE SUBDIVISION.
 - RESTRICTIONS ON USE OF CRITICAL SLOPE EASEMENT AREAS USE AND OCCUPANCY OF ALL CRITICAL SLOPE EASEMENT AREAS IS LIMITED TO THOSE USES EXPRESSLY IDENTIFIED HEREIN AND ARE TO BE USED EXCLUSIVELY BY THE RESPECTIVE OWNERS OF THE LOT OR HILLSIDE PARCEL AND THEIR GUESTS AND INVITEES IN ACCORDANCE WITH THESE RESTRICTIONS:**
 - SUCH USE WILL BE RESTRICTED TO FOOT TRAFFIC ONLY AND INCIDENTAL PERSONAL OHV (OFF HIGHWAY VEHICLE) USE ONLY. THE USE OF OHVS SHALL BE LIMITED TO PURPOSES OF TRAVERSING THE PROPERTY AND NOT FOR RACING, HILL CLIMBING, MOTORCROSS OR OTHER SUCH ACTIVITIES THAT MAY UNDULY DISTURB VEGETATION AND CAUSE EROSION.
 - NO PAVING, OUTBUILDING, SHED OR TEMPORARY BUILDING OF ANY KIND SHALL BE ERRECTED, CONSTRUCTED, PERMITTED OR MAINTAINED ON, UNDER, OR WITHIN THE CRITICAL SLOPE EASEMENT AREAS.
 - EXCEPT AS PROVIDED HEREIN, THE LOT OR HILLSIDE PARCEL UPON WHICH ANY OF THE CRITICAL SLOPE EASEMENT AREAS ARE LOCATED SHALL NOT BE EXCAVATED, GRADED, FILLED, LITTERED, DUMPED OR VEGETATION DISTURBED (EXCEPT AS IS REASONABLY NECESSARY WHEN PLANTING ADDITIONAL PLANTS, SHRUBS, OR TREES) NOR BE USED TO STORE MATERIALS UPON, OVER, OR ACROSS THE CRITICAL SLOPE EASEMENT AREA.
 - SOILS EXCAVATED AS PART OF THE CONSTRUCTION OF APPROVED STRUCTURES SHALL NOT BE DEPOSITED NOR STORED WITHIN THE CRITICAL SLOPE EASEMENT AREA. SOILS MAY BE TEMPORARILY STORED WITHIN THE BUILDING ENVELOPE FOR THE PURPOSES OF BACKFILLING THE FOUNDATION AND THE REMAINING SOIL SHALL BE REMOVED FROM THE SITE.
 - ADDITIONAL PLANTS, SHRUBS, AND TREES MAY BE PLANTED UPON THE CRITICAL SLOPE EASEMENT AREAS INCLUDING LIMITED EXCAVATION AND IRRIGATION THAT IS REASONABLY NECESSARY TO PLANT ANY SUCH PLANTS, SHRUBS, AND TREES. EXCAVATION AND DISTURBANCE WILL BE LIMITED TO HAND DIGGING AND THE USE OF A SMALL TRENCHER FOR IRRIGATION PURPOSES. NATIVE VEGETATION SHALL NOT BE DISTURBED ON SLOPES GREATER THAN 30% EXCEPT AS ALLOWED IN THIS SECTION.
 - PRIVATE RECREATIONAL USES. CRITICAL SLOPE EASEMENT AREAS MAY BE PERMITTED BY LAND USE PERMIT FROM THE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT FOR THE PURPOSES OF PRIVATE RECREATIONAL (NON-COMMERCIAL) USE ONLY.
- DEVELOPER THE FOREGOING NOTWITHSTANDING, SAID RESTRICTIONS UPON EXCAVATION, GRADING, AND FILLING SHALL NOT APPLY TO GRADING AND FILLING PERFORMED BY THE DEVELOPER IN ACCORDANCE WITH AN APPROVED DEVELOPMENT GRADING PLAN.
- MAINTENANCE THE RESPECTIVE OWNERS OF THE LOTS UPON WHICH ANY PORTION OF THE CRITICAL SLOPE EASEMENT AREAS MAY BE LOCATED SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR MAINTAINING THAT PORTION OF THE CRITICAL SLOPE EASEMENT AREAS WHICH IS LOCATED ON THEIR RESPECTIVE LOTS.





26 1. PUBLIC COMMENTS
27

28 There were no public comments.
29

30 2. CONSIDERATION OF A CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT FOR A TOTAL
31 COMBINED DRIVEWAY WIDTH OF 40 FEET AT 14 EAST 250 NORTH, MIKE
32 ROBINSON, APPLICANT
33

34 Mackenzie Johnson reported on the conditional use permit application for a total combined
35 driveway width of 40 feet at 14 East 250 North. The property, zoned R1-7, is a corner lot with
36 frontage on Main Street and 250 North. The existing structure on the lot has two units with one
37 above the other, a two car carport, and a one car garage. The existing drive approach on 250
38 North measured 25 feet wide at the back of the sidewalk. The property owner, Mike Robinson,
39 desired to convert the existing garage and carport into a third dwelling unit but was informed by
40 the City that only single-family or two-family (duplex) dwelling units were permitted in the R1-7
41 zone. In response, Mr. Robinson changed his plan from adding a third unit to remodeling the
42 structure by turning the carport and garage into additional living space for the lower unit of the
43 duplex. Per the floor plan submitted by the applicant, the plan would be converting the existing

44 kitchen and laundry room in the lower unit into a bedroom, converting the carport into a family
45 room with a new kitchen, bathroom, mudroom, and laundry room, as well as converting the
46 garage into three additional bedrooms. These changes would increase the bedroom count in the
47 lower unit from two to six. The proposed remodel would eliminate the existing required covered
48 parking which necessitated the addition of two covered spaces elsewhere on the property.

49
50 Mackenzie Johnson explained that the R1-7 zone permitted single-family and two-family
51 dwellings (duplex) and prohibited three-family dwellings (triplex). The City did not limit the
52 number of bedrooms in a dwelling unit but regulated occupancy. City code defined a dwelling
53 unit as “one or more rooms in a dwelling, apartment complex, hotel or motel, providing
54 complete, independent living facilities for a single person or family, including permanent
55 provisions for living, sleeping, eating, cooking and sanitation”. City code defined a family as
56 “one individual, or two (2) or more persons related by blood, marriage or adoption, living
57 together in a single dwelling unit and maintaining a common household. A family may include
58 four (4), but not more than four (4), nonrelated persons living with the residing family. The term
59 “family” shall not be construed to mean a group of nonrelated individuals, a fraternity, club or
60 institutional group”. The Development Review Committee (DRC) recommended that the
61 Commission place a clear condition on the approval that the property may only be used as a
62 duplex and each unit may only be rented or used by a single family or no more than four
63 unrelated individuals at any given time, as defined by code.

64
65 The applicant, Mike Robinson, proposed to meet the required parking onsite by building a new
66 carport to the east of the existing garage and a new carport south of the existing home. City code
67 requires a minimum of two parking stalls, one of which must be covered , per unit for a duplex.
68 Mr. Robinson requested to increase the existing driveway width from 25 feet to 30 feet on 250
69 North and to create a new 10 foot wide driveway on Main Street to access the new carports.

70
71 Staff reviewed the proposal and determined it to be in compliance with City code, particularly in
72 regard to distance from the intersection and property lines. City code 10-6-2 allowed residential
73 lots with a frontage greater than 100 feet to be permitted up to two access driveways. The
74 property would be allowed a total maximum driveway width of 30 feet, or as established by a
75 conditional use permit not to exceed 40 feet. Additionally, code regulated that a driveway be a
76 minimum of three feet from the nearest side property line, a minimum of 50 feet from an
77 intersection, and could not be built over an existing water meter.

78
79 Staff recommended a condition that an engineered site plan be prepared to ensure the accuracy of
80 the property lines and site improvements prior to the issuance of an excavation permit or
81 building permit for the accessory structures. There appeared to be a discrepancy or overlap of
82 property lines in the legal descriptions of this property and the property to the south, likely
83 attributable to the two legal descriptions beginning from two different monuments. The final
84 determination on the exact property line location would be a civil matter between the two
85 property owners which may be resolved by a boundary line agreement or additional survey work.

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The DRC recommended approval of the conditional use permit for a total combined driveway width of 40 feet at 14 East 250 North with the conditions that the property may only be used as duplex and each unit may only be rented or used by a single family or no more than four unrelated individuals at any given time, as defined by code 10-1-47 as well as a requirement for an engineered site plan to be prepared to ensure accuracy of the property lines and location of site improvements prior to the issuance of an excavation permit or building permit for the accessory structures.

Commissioner Jorgensen asked about parking and if spaces would be assigned to each unit. Mike Robinson did not have a plan in place for the management of the parking and asked if the Commission had a recommendation.

Commissioner Jorgensen mentioned that the ground floor unit would have six bedrooms and asked for clarification on the code language “one individual, or two (2) or more persons related by blood, marriage or adoption, living together in a single dwelling unit and maintaining a common household. A family may include four (4), but not more than four (4), nonrelated persons living with the residing family.” He asked if this meant four nonrelated persons in addition to a related family. Sherrie Pace clarified that this meant either four unrelated persons or a related family.

Commissioner Holbrook asked if there was a basement as part of the existing duplex. He said it would be very easy to turn the bottom duplex into a third unit. Sherrie Pace responded that there was a half basement that was part of the bottom unit. She said all of the existing plumbing for the existing kitchen would need to be capped so they could not create a third unit. The existing construction would also need to meet the building code and pass inspection.

Mackenzie Johnson commented that the property owner originally commenced construction on the duplex without obtaining a building permit. The City was notified and the Building Official “red tagged” the building, meaning that construction stopped and could not continue or restart until the proper permits were issued.

Commissioner Jorgensen asked about parking capacity on the existing driveway accessible off 250 North versus what was proposed. Mackenzie Johnson responded that the existing parking allowed for four to five vehicles and estimated that two additional spaces would be created with the Main Street access and carport for a total of five to seven parking spaces.

Sherrie Pace clarified that per State code a conditional use was a permitted use with conditions. She said the conditions the Commission could place on the driveway must be related to that driveway and serve the purpose of mitigating any potential impacts such as those related to clear view requirements.

128 Vice Chair Ward commented that the first condition was more of a restatement of the code. He
129 said the second condition requiring an engineered site plan was related to the driveway. Sherrie
130 Pace replied that there was a current property overlap and clarification was needed on the
131 property lines.

132
133 Mackenzie Johnson said that a correct survey would allow staff to determine that the property
134 lines and setbacks were correct and met code requirements.

135
136 Commissioner Tucker asked about the property overlap. Sherrie Pace commented staff had
137 determined that the difference was approximately three feet.

138
139 **Commissioner Tucker moved that the Planning Commission approve the conditional use**
140 **permit for a total combined driveway width of 40 feet at 14 East 250 North with the**
141 **following condition:**

142
143 **1) An engineered site plan be prepared to ensure accuracy of the property lines and**
144 **location of site improvements prior to the issuance of an excavation permit or**
145 **building permit for the accessory structures.**

146
147 **And the statement that the property may only be used as duplex and each unit may only be**
148 **rented or used by a single family or no more than four unrelated individuals at any given**
149 **time, as defined by code 10-1-47.**

150
151 Commissioner Stone spoke on the history of the property and that there was no way to enforce
152 the occupancy. Sherrie Pace replied that there was a building code violation as construction was
153 started without a permit. She said there were two remedies for the violation which included
154 removing any additions and construction and restoring the property to its previous condition or
155 the applicant could apply for and receive a building permit. A building permit could not be
156 issued for the work without the applicant also providing the required parking.

157
158 Commissioner Jorgensen commented that the first issue was whether the parking was adequate.
159 He spoke on the proposal for six bedrooms in the ground floor unit and that the
160 recommendations from the DRC made sense.

161
162 Sherrie Pace said the rear parking would most likely be used by the bottom unit as it had a rear
163 entry door.

164
165 Commissioner Holbrook was in agreement and said that staff and the inspectors would ensure
166 the duplex did not become a triplex. Commissioner Tucker said the request met the requirements
167 of the code.

168

169 **Commissioner Holbrook seconded the motion. The motion was approved by**
170 **Commissioners Holbrook, Jorgensen, Maus, Stone, Tucker and Ward. Commissioner**
171 **Larson was excused.**

172
173 HEALTH & WELLNESS COMMITTEE PRESENTATION

174
175 Rachel Butterfield reported that the Health & Wellness Committee was created in December of
176 2021 per the request of Mayor Arave. The Committee had since established roles and found
177 overlap with other committees and boards in the City. She shared the 2022 Committee
178 accomplishments including establishing “who we are” with a focus on specific areas, adopting
179 organizational bylaws, procedures, and protocols, having a presence at the Night Out Against
180 Crime event, creating a partnership with Communities That Care and holding two weekly classes
181 and one evening training meeting, participating in the County Emergency Preparedness Fair,
182 receiving the State of Utah Healthy Communities Award, attending the Senior Lunch Bunch
183 events, and increased social media outreach.

184
185 Rachel Butterfield shared the established duties of the Committee including a review of research
186 and programs related to five specific areas of interest which were physical and mental health,
187 emergency preparedness, personal wellness, food and housing access, addiction, and any other
188 public health and general welfare issues.

189
190 The goals for physical and mental health were to complete an inventory of existing City open
191 space, parks, and outdoor assets (Hatch Park, mountain trails, etc.), to conduct four classes a year
192 with Communities That Care, and to complete an inventory of school safe walking routes, trails,
193 and pathways.

194
195 For emergency preparedness, the goal was for social media outreach four times per year related
196 to emergency preparedness and three times per year related to CERT training or as often as
197 needed to educate residents about CERT training opportunities.

198
199 The personal wellness goals included a quarterly newsletter spotlight on an outdoor amenity
200 available to residents, to issue letters of support and encouragement to the Parks, Trails, Arts &
201 Recreation Advisory Board, the Planning Commission, and the City Council related to the
202 provisions of personal wellness amenities and activities in the City, to combine a Committee
203 activity with the City’s Night Out Against Crime event, and completion of the Wellness Survey
204 through Utah State University.

205
206 The food and housing goal was to provide letters of support and encouragement to the City
207 Council, Youth City Council, City staff, and the PTAR Board for the creation of events such as
208 food drives and support of existing food pantries.

209

210 The goals related to addiction was the creation of a resource document with links to be placed on
211 the City’s website related to addiction recovery resources as well as providing addiction recovery
212 materials at the Night Out Against Crime event.

213
214 Rachel Butterfield said they were happy to work together on any ideas the Commission might
215 have.

216
217 Commissioner Jorgensen mentioned mobile food pantries could be set up in a church parking lot
218 or somewhere similar. He also spoke on emergency preparedness and the unique hazards in the
219 City and what preparation could be done.

220
221 Janet Welsh asked the Commission to focus on optimizing biking and walkability in future
222 developments.

223
224 Commissioner Tucker mentioned the Wellness Study through Utah State University.
225 Commissioner Ward asked about the results of the study. Sherrie Pace replied that staff would
226 share the results with the Commission.

227
228 3. REPORT ON CITY COUNCIL ACTIONS ON ITEMS RECOMMENDED BY
229 PLANNING COMMISSION

230
231 Sherrie Pace reported on the site plan for the WDG Flex Building which was approved at the last
232 City Council meeting. The Commission was reminded of the need to complete their required
233 training hours before June 30th.

234
